Deciduous Shrubs

Autumn Magic Chokeberry (Aronia melanocarpa)

Masses of white flower clusters in spring are followed by black-purple berries in late summer.
The glossy green leaves turn fluorescent red in the fall.
This very versatile plant is tolerant of sun or shade and dry or moist soil.

Zone: 2

Mature height: 4 ft Mature spread: 4 ft



Blue Muffin Arrowwood (Viburnum dentatum 'Christom')

This compact selection of viburnum has creamy white flowers with blue-black fruits in fall. Green summer foliage turns yellow and red in fall. It is adaptable from full sun to shade, and tolerant of moist soils

Zone: 2

Mature height: 4-6 ft Mature spread: 4-6 ft



Cherry Bomb Barberry (Berberis thunbergi 'Cherry Bomb')

Features: Deep crimson red foliage graces the arching stems of this small shrub. Showy bright red berries appear in fall and persist into winter. Foliage colour is best when grown in full sun. This is an excellent border or foundation plant.

Light: Sun **Zone:** 3

Mature height: 3 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Concorde Barberry (Berberis thunbergi 'Concorde')

Features: This compact shrub has dramatic burgundy coloured foliage and is a fine contrast in the landscape. It has small teardrop-shaped leaves on thorny branches which grow in an orderly round shape. It is good in any number of sunny spaces where a small colourful shrub is preferred.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 2 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Rose Glow Barberry (Berberis thunbergi 'Rose Glow')

Features: Graceful branching with a deep rose red glow over mottled white and green foliage makes this a very attractive small shrub. It is useful as hedging, barrier, or in mass planting but is also a lovely feature shrub in a perennial bed.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 3-4 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Royal Cloak Barberry (Berberis thunbergi 'Royal Cloak')

Features: This cultivar is noted for its upright arching growth habit and large reddish-purple leaves. Leaves vary in size from ½-2 inches long and are a dark burgundy. Bright red berries form in the fall and often persist into winter after leaf drop. Stems have sharp thorns.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 4-5ft Mature spread: 4-5ft



Sunsation Barberry (Berberis thunbergi 'Sunsation')

Features: This golden barberry is an exciting compact dwarf form. It displays attractive non-burning golden foliage with a slight orange tint most of the season. It is an excellent colour contrast in borders. It is a slow grower.

Mature height: 3 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Dwarf Yellow Broom (Genista lydia)

Features: This is an outstanding small flowering shrub that produces slender pendulous branches covered with light green leaves. Beginning in early June, golden yellow flowers cover the branches creating a real showpiece. It forms a mound shape, wider than tall. It is a unique addition to foundation plantings or borders.

Purple Broom (Cytisus purpureus)

Features: This shrub is absolutely covered in glowing lilac-pink flowers in early June. It is a good groundcover, spreading by underground runners and the arching branches will root where they touch the ground. It is best kept to itself to fill a difficult area. It excels in hot dry sites and full sun. Spring pruning may be needed due to tip kill above the snow line.

Buffaloberry (Shepherdia argentea)

Features: This tall shrub has a rugged twisting irregular branching habit. Its silver foliage makes it a popular accent plant. Small yellow male and female flowers occur on separate plants which, when pollinated, produce juicy, edible red fruit. With proper pruning, this shrub can be formed into an interesting accent tree.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 8-12 ft Mature spread: 6-10 ft



Dwarf Winged Burning Bush (Euonymous alata 'Compacta')

Features: This small variety has bright green leaves and a fine texture throughout the season. It produces a rich red orange fall colour, most impressive on those planted in full sun and during long cool autumns. It is an excellent choice for formal clipped specimens or as a backdrop for flowers.

Light: Sun to part shade.

Zone: 3

Mature height: 2 ½-3 ft Mature spread: 2 ½-3 ft



Fireball Burning Bush (Euonymus alata)

Features: This selection of compact burning bush has tighter branching and superior hardiness than others. It is best known for its bright red fall foliage. Its branches and twigs have unusual corky ridges that protrude form the bark, giving the branches a square-ish cross-section.

Light: Sun to part shade.

Zone: 3

Mature height: 5-6 ft Mature spread: 4-7 ft



Turkestan Burning Bush (Euonymous nanus turkestanica)

Features: This sprawling dense ground cover can tolerate dry conditions once established. It produces bright pink seed pods in late summer. Thin, almost needle-like foliage is a dark green during the summer, turning deep red burgundy for the fall, especially in full sun locations.

Light: Sun to part shade.

Zone: 3

Mature height: 2 ½-3 ft Mature spread: 2 ½-3 ft



Common Caragana (Caragana arborescens)

Features: This shrub enjoys considerable popularity as a tall barrier hedge and windbreak plant. It grows in an upright spreading form. It is covered with green compound leaves and produces numerous small bright yellow flowers. It is noted for surviving in extremely dry conditions.

Light: Sun to part shade.

Zone: 2

Mature height: 9-11 ft **Mature spread:** 5-7 ft



Fernleaf Caragana-(Caragana arborescens 'Lorbergii')

Features: This attractive medium growing shrub has slender grass-like leaves. Small yellow flowers are produced in spring. Arching branches are best displayed in a tree form where they can shade low-lying plants. This truly hardy selection deserves a much wider use.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 10-12 ft Mature spread: 6-7 ft




Globe Caragana (Caragana frutex 'Globosa')

Features: This beautiful plant forms a perfect globe without any pruning. It has dense green foliage with leaves similar in shape to a 4-leaf clover. It is ideal to plant in full sun where dwarf cedars would have difficulty.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 3 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Pygmy Caragana (Caragana pygmaea)

Features: This plant prefers sunny, dry and well drained sites. It will form a compact ball shape which is closed to the base. Foliage is green with a blue tinge and flowers are yellow pea-like flowers. It is a dense thorny shrub which can be useful as a barrier hedge. It is well adapted to drought once established.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 4-6 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Silver Spires Caragana-Topgraft (Caragana microphylla)

Features: This extremely drought tolerant shrub has sparkling ferny silver leaves with a narrow, upright arching habit. It produces 1 inch yellow flowers in spring followed by smooth red narrow seed pods in summer. It is very hardy for our prairie gardens and highly deer resistant. Do not plant in wet areas.

Walker Weeping Caragana-Top-Grafted

(Caragana arborescens 'Walkers')

Features: This unique shrub has trailing branches grafted onto a caragana trunk or standard. Delicate fern-like leaves with a bright green colour create a flowing effect on the trailing branches that can reach the ground. It is very durable for hot sunny sites and makes an excellent focal point.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 3-6 ft determined by graft

Mature spread: 3-4 ft



Weeping Caragana (Caragana arborescens 'Pendula')

Features: This shrub has a trailing effect for a unique focal point. Bright yellow flowers appear along the length of the branches from mid-late May. Leaves are small, bright green ovals along cascading branches.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 3-6 ft determined by graft

height.

Mature spread: 3-5 ft



Peking Cotoneaster (Cotoneaster acutifolius)

Features: Most commonly used as a hedge plant this shrub also makes an attractive specimen plant. Its form is upright spreading with dark glossy green leaves. It turns bright orange-red in the fall. Small dark blue berries are produced in late summer. It is very vigorous and hardy and responds well to pruning and shaping.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 4-6 ft Mature spread: 2.5-3 ft



Bailey's Compact Cranberry (Viburnum trilobum 'Bailey')

Features: This is an excellent compact form of American highbush cranberry. Its beautiful green lobed foliage turns a deep red in the fall. Flowers and fruit are sparse. It is ideally sized for foundation planting and adaptable to many growing conditions including moist and full shade locations.

Light: Sun to shade

Mature height: 5-6 ft Mature spread: 5-6 ft



Compact European Cranberry (Viburnum opulus 'Compactum')

Features: Showy white flower clusters appear in mid-June followed by bright red berries in late summer. Foliage develops rich burgundy red colour in fall. This upright spreading shrub is adaptable to many different conditions including moist soil and full shade.

Light: Sun to shade

Zone: 2

Mature height: 4-5 ft Mature spread: 4-5 ft



Dwarf European Cranberry (Viburnum opulus 'Nanum')

Features: This dwarf shrub is low growing and densely branched. It rarely flowers but when it does, small bright red fruit clusters appear in fall, often persisting into the winter months. Leaves are dark green with 3-lobes, similar to maple leaves. Fall colour ins reddish –purple.

Light: Sun to shade

Nannyberry (Viburnum lentago)

Features: This large shrub has an upright vase shaped form. Tiny white flowers develop into showy clusters which are followed by black berries which often remain into the winter attracting birds. Fall colour is brilliant red.

American Highbush Cranberry (Viburnum trilobum)

Features: This is a leggy shrub that thrives in shady wet sites, but will tolerate a sunny, drier location. In mid-June, clusters of small white flowers add interest to deep green foliage. Bright red berries follow in early August and persist all winter, attracting birds. Fall colour is a rich red.

Snowball Cranberry (Viburnum opulus 'Roseum')

Features: Snowballs in June!! This variety of viburnum is known as 'Snowball' because of the white flowers it produces which are gathered into large, conspicuous, globular heads. Because the flowers are sterile, this shrub cannot produce fruit. Leaves are a lush dark green

Light: Sun to shade

Mohican Wayfaring Tree (Viburnum lantana)

Features: Soft fuzzy leaves in a sage green colour emerge in mid May. The small white flowers appear in large clusters in early June. Yellow berries follow that later change to red, then black. This is a dense globe-shaped shrub that is one of the most drought and alkali tolerant of the cranberry family. Fall colour is a rich red.

Light: Sun to shade

Alpine Currant (Ribes alpinum)

Features: This popular plant is ideal for shady location, but also tolerates full sun. It is dense and full to the base. This plant has bright green leaves that are a clear yellow in the fall. It is often seen as a hedge plant because of its thick branching habit and overall durability. It is easily kept at 3' tall and wide.

Baton Rouge Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Minbat')

Features: This naturally compact bushy shrub offers amazing year round interest for any landscape. White spring flowers are loved by butterflies. White berries follow that are loved by birds. Medium green foliage transforms into a brilliant reddish hue is autumn. Bright red stems in winter make a spectacular display.

Light: Sun to full shade

Mature height: 3-4 ft Mature spread: 3-4 ft



Bud's Yellow Twig Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Bud's Yellow')

Features: This upright rounded shrub has green foliage throughout the season changing to yellow in the fall. Clusters of creamy white flowers appear at the ends of the branches in late spring. White berries are produced in mid-summer. The yellow branches are very showy and add significant winter interest in the landscape.

Light: Sun to shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 5-7 ft Mature spread: 5-7 ft



Cream Cracker Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Cream Cracker')

Features: This dwarf rounded shrub has green leaves with creamy coloured margins. Striking dark red stems are quite

showy in winter.

Mature height: 3 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Golden Variegated Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Gouchaultii')

Features: This shrub is noted for its colourful leaf pattern which is green with a yellow margin, some having a slight tinge of red. Best colour is achieved in full sun but even in shade it provides bright contrast. Red bark on new wood provides great winter colour.

Isanti Dogwood (Cornus sericea 'Isanti')

Features: This dense mounding dogwood has white flowers appearing in spring. Its green leaves change to a rich red fall colour when planted in full sun. Its bright red twigs brighten the winter landscape.

Mature height: 5-6 ft Mature spread: 5-6 ft



Ivory Halo Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Bailhalo')

Features: This is more compact than the original silverleaf dogwood. Its oval leaves are deep green with a creamy white edge. It provides rich red fall colour in full sun. White spring flowers are followed by blue berries.

Light: Sun to shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 5-6 ft Mature spread: 5-6 ft



Kesselring Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Kesselring')

Features: This dogwood cultivar has unusual deep purple branches which add an unusual winter accent. Dark green foliage emerges purple in spring. Small white flowers are produced in clusters from mid to late June and are showy against the emerging purple leaves. White berries appear in summer.

Little Rebel Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Jefreb')

Features: This cultivar has densely arranged blood-red stems which are a welcome addition to the winter prairie landscape. Its medium green summer foliage gives way to burgundy in the fall.

Mature height: 3-4 ft Mature spread: 3-4 ft



Morden Amber Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Morden Amber')

Features: Rich golden-yellow foliage contrasts nicely with dark red bark. Fall colour is a reddish flush over the yellow. This variety will brighten a shady area, though the leaf colour will be less vibrant.

Red Osier Dogwood (Cornus sericea)

Features: This is a thicket forming shrub that grows quickly. It has small white flowers that are followed by small white fruit. In the fall its foliage turns from green to purple. Red stems provide a nice contrast to winter snow. This rugged plant will grow in swampy conditions and will thrive in sun or shade. It is good cover for birds and wildlife.

Siberian Pearls Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Siberica')

Features: This is a more compact Siberian red-twig dogwood. Leaves are ovate in shape, deep green in colour and produce a rich red fall colour in full sun. Small white summer flowers are followed by blue fruit. The scarlet red bark is a striking contrast against winter snow. It grows quickly and makes a nice backdrop for spring bulbs.

Siberian Variegated Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Siberica Variegata')

Features: Distinctive variegated cream and green foliage on bright red bark makes this dogwood a popular choice for the shrub bed. It will brighten a shady corner or help accent a dark leafed plant Fall colour is reddish-purple blush over white


Silver and Gold Dogwood (Cornus sericea 'Silver and Gold')

Features: In this variety the foliage is variegated cream and green but the bark is bright yellow, providing a strong and showy winter accent. Leaves maintain their variegation in a partially shady location. To obtain the best stem colour, prune back every second April to 10-12 inches above ground level.

Silver Charm Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Silver Charm')

Features: This is one of our most popular shrubs. Leaves are ovate in shape, deep green with a white edge. It turns rich red in the fall if planted in full sun. Small white flower clusters in summer are followed by blue berries. It is an excellent addition to a mixed border.

Silver Variegated Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Argenteo-marginata')

Features: This very colorful shrub has variegated green and white foliage developing a reddish-purple blush over white in the fall. White flower clusters appear mid spring. The dark red bark provides excellent winter colour. It is quite tolerant of wet areas and is fast growing. This is also available as a tree form.

Strawberry Daiquiri Dogwood (Cornus alba 'Stdazam')

Features: This dogwood has attractive green foliage edged in creamy white throughout the season. Fall colour is an outstanding red. Clusters of buttery yellow flowers appear at the ends of the branches in late spring. Powder blue berries follow in mid summer. The red branches are extremely showy in winter.

Light: Sun to shade

Black Lace Elder (Sambucus nigra 'Eva')

Features: Black Lace has dramatic, almost black dissected foliage and produces beautiful creamy pink buds and flowers form mid to late June. Flowers are followed by blackish red berries in autumn. It thrives in a wide variety of garden soils in sun or part shade. Colour is less intense in shade. For best shape and foliage, prune hard in early spring and provide even moisture.

Golden Elder (Sambucus canadensis 'Aurea')

Features: This is a very beautiful contrasting shrub with golden coloured leaves and clusters of white flowers in spring. Foliage remains brilliant yellow if it is planted in full sun. It will appear lime-green in part shade. This plant is easy to grow.

Light: Sun to shade

Mature height: 7-8 ft Mature spread: 6-7 ft



Goldenlocks Elder (Sambucus racemosa 'Goldenlocks')

Features: This an exceptionally beautiful compact shrub with its bright golden leaves and finely cut foliage. It produces clusters of cherry red fruit in early fall. Foliage will be brilliant yellow if planted in full sun but in part shade the colour will be limey-green.

Light: Sun to part shade

Golden Sutherland Elder (Sambucus racemosa 'Sutherland')

Features: This cultivar of the European Red Elder was developed in Saskatchewan. Finely dissected foliage is bright golden when planted in full sun. It is an alternative choice to the Japanese Maple for those wanting an Asian inspired garden on the prairies. Protect from strong winds or browning will occur on delicate leaves.

Lemony Lace Elder (Sambucus canadensis 'Aurea')

Features: Finely dissected foliage in a cheery gold colour will really light up the landscape. This North American native produces big clusters of white flowers in mid spring. Then bright yellow leaves edged in red take emerge in spring, maturing to chartreuse. The bright red fruit is appealing but not considered edible.

Light: Sun to part shade

Madonna Elder (Sambucus nigra 'Madonna')

Features: Large clusters of fragrant flowers and brightly variegated green and cream leaves grace this shrub. Small black berry clusters appear in late summer attracting birds to the tree. Elders will tolerate wet planting sites. Some winter dieback is common on this plant.

Morden Glow Elder

(Sambucus racemosa 'Morden Golden Glow')

Features: This shrub is very beautiful with its lacey golden foliage colour and clusters of white flowers. It will remain bright gold in full sun but will become limey-green in part shade.

Mature height: 5 ft Mature spread: 5 ft



Red Berried Elder (Sambucus racemosa)

Features: Large clusters of tiny white flowers appear in early to mid-summer. Bright red berries follow. This shrub prefers full sun with moist soil. Avoid planting in windy sights. Prune before leafing in spring to encourage heavy new growth. The berries are a favourite of birds so include this shrub if you wish to have birds.

Ashleaf (False) Spirea (Sorbaria sorbifolia)

Features: This tall thicket forming shrub has compound leaves that resemble those of Mountain Ash. Large white plume-shaped flowers rise above deep green foliage in late summer. This shrub is great for difficult spots, mass plantings, and stabilizing slopes.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 4-5 ft Mature spread: 4-5 ft



Sem False Spirea (Sorbaria sorbifolia)

Features: Sem is a more compact and lower growing form of the common False Spirea. Spring leaves emerge orange-bronze, gradually turning green for summer. Spikes of white flower plumes rise above rich green foliage. They make excellent dried flowers. Fall colour is rusty red.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 3-4 ft



Flowering Raspberry (Rubus odoratus)

Features: Grown for its showy blooms rather than its fruit, this shrub has big purple flowers about 2" across, and huge green 5-lobed leaves 4-12" across. It grows well in sun or shade. It requires regular spring pruning to maintain a compact form.

Northern Gold Forsythia (Forsythia ovata 'Northern Gold')

Features: The first to bloom in the spring, this shrub produces bright yellow flowers along the length of its branches before the glossy green leaves emerge. Leaves turn yellow in the fall. It will grow in full sun to part shade. Protection from north winds and providing snow cover will increase degree of flowering.

Flowering Almond or Russian Almond (*Prunus tenella*)

Features: This small globe-shaped plant has shiny, bright green narrow leaves. Bright rosered flower buds open to soft pink single flowers which are produced along the stems in early spring. Fall colour is a bright orange-red. It has a suckering habit and is an excellent choice on slopes or in massed plantings.

Light: Sun Zone: 3


Miniglobe Honeysuckle (Lonicera xylosteoides 'Miniglobe')

Features: Light green rounded leaves, and a dense squat round shape make this a good choice for low foundations or border groupings. Soft yellow flowers in late May are followed by red berries. Drought tolerant once established.

Honeyrose Honeysuckle (Lonicera 'Honeyrose')

Features: This is a medium sized shrub with clusters of fragrant, rosy red flowers in early to mid June. The foliage is deep blue-green. This shrub is resistant to the honeysuckle witches broom aphid. It is very hardy and drought tolerant once established


Annabelle Hydrangea (Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle')

Features: This stunning white hydrangea often produces flower heads 10 inches in diameter. It blooms on new growth. Prune stems to 8-10 inches in early spring. The blooms appear in profusion is mid July and often last into September.

Light: Part shade

Zone: 3

Bobo Hydrangea (Hydrangea paniculata 'llvobo ')

Features: This dwarf hydrangea will turn heads. Large white flowers are held upright on strong stems and continue to grow and lengthen as they bloom. The flowers turn pink in fall. It blooms from mid August through autumn and is a marvelous addition to any garden, especially those with limited space.

Light: Sun to shade

Fire & Ice Hydrangea (Hydrangea paniculata 'Wim's Red')

Features: Its easy to see where this hydrangea got its name. Blooms start off creamy white in early summer, change to rose pink in mid-summer and become a deep rich red in autumn. This shrub is very heat and shade tolerant.

Light: Sun to shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 5-6 ft Mature spread: 3-4 ft



Incrediball Hydrangea (Hydrangea arborescens 'Incrediball')

Features: Huge lime-green 10 inch flowers emerge in late summer. This cultivar is very cold hardy. 'Incrediball' blooms on new wood on sturdy upright



White to mauve berries are produced abundantly in late summer and fall and persist into winter. Its branches are useful in floral arrangements


Dakota Goldcharm Spirea (Spiraea japonica 'Mertyann')

Deep green lobed leaves through summer turn yellow-orange for fall. Pruning should occur immediately after flowering if needed.

Features: Fresh growth begins with red tips in the spring, shifting in late spring and summer to rich red-tipped chartreuse foliage which holds its colour into fall. Cherry pink flowers develop in mid-June and last through most of the summer. This quick growing and compact spirea packs a lot of colour and life into a small space. If required, prune early in spring before plant leafs out.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 2-3 ft



Neon Flash Spirea (Spiraea japonica 'Neon Flash')

Features: Fresh growth begins as a reddishpurple, shifting in late spring and summer to a deep green and finally to a rich burgundy in the fall. Complimenting all these changes are the bright cherry pink flowers that appear in June and last though most of the summer. Its compact size makes it ideal for almost any landscape or garden placement.

Light: Sun **Zone**: 3

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 2-3 ft




Renaissance Spirea (Spiraea x vanhouttei 'Renaissance')

Features: This shrub has arching boughs blooming with snow white flowers in mid to late spring. The bright white blossoms are stunning on cloudy days or in moonlight. Its fountain shape makes it an ideal specimen shrub. Its fall colour is orange red. If needed, pruning should occur after flowering.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 5 ft Mature spread: 7 ft



Shirobana Spirea (Spiraea japonica 'Shirobana')

Features: Showy white, pink and deep rose flowers are borne prolifically in upright rounded clusters up to 4" in diameter in summer. Leaves are sharply-toothed, deep green on top, grayish-green below, lance-shaped and up to 3" long. This compact mounded form is fast-growing, and excellent in a shrub border.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 1 ½ ft Mature spread: 3-3 ½ ft



Snowmound Spirea (Spiraea nipponica 'Snowmound')

Features: Part of the spring flowering group of spireas, this shrub blooms with tiny white flowers massed in clusters on the tips of the stems. Prune after flowering, removing 1/3 of the older, weaker branches. The Snowmound is one of the last whites to bloom from mid-June to early July.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 2-3 ft



Sparkling Carpet Spirea (Spirea japonica 'Sparkling Carpet')

Features: This is an ultra dwarf version of the favorite Magic Carpet Spirea. Goldenlime foliage with bronze tinged new growth changes to reddish-purple in the fall. Dark pink clustered flowers bloom in summer adding a wonderful colour contrast in any landscape setting.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 8 in Mature spread: 1 ft



Tor Spirea (Spiraea betulifolia 'Tor')

Features: This unusual variety of white flowering spirea has iridescent green leaves that resemble those of a birch. This dwarf variety has a mounding form, bright white flower clusters in mid-June and unusual purple fall colour. It is great in a mixed border or flower bed.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 3- ft



Cutleaf Smooth Sumac (Rhus glabra lacinata')

Features: This exotic looking hardy shrub has deeply cut compound leaves which are medium green in the summer turning to an outstanding scarlet in the fall. Spikes of green flowers rise above the foliage in summer followed by scarlet fruit clusters on female plants displayed in abundance from fall through winter. Suckering can occur, so plant in a contained area.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 5-10 ft Mature spread: 5-10 ft



Gro-Low Sumac (Rhus aromatica 'Gro-Low')

Features: A low-growing spreading shrub covered in dense aromatic foliage has abundant small yellow flowers in spring followed by showy berries through summer. Fall colour is a brilliant red. This is a good choice to plant to stabilize a hillside.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 2

Mature height: 2 ½ ft Mature spread: 5-7 ft



Tiger Eyes Sumac (Rhus typhina 'Tiger Eyes')

Features: The new spring growth is a lively chartreuse green. It quickly changes to a bright golden yellow which contrasts with the rosy pink leaf stems. The deeply cut drooping leaflets are wonderful in an Asian inspired garden. Fall colour is an intense scarlet. It is best planted in a protected spot.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 6 ft Mature spread: 6 ft



Staghorn Sumac (Rhus glabra)

Features: This shrub has large tropical looking green leaves in the summer which turn to an outstanding scarlet in the fall. Its spikes of yellow flowers rise above the foliage in summer. On the female plants, crimson fruits on showy plumes are displayed from late summer through winter. It has an upright spreading habit. Suckering can occur, so plant in a contained area.

Light: Sun **Zone**: 3

Mature height: 6-10 ft Mature spread: 10-13 ft



Mohican Wayfaring Tree (Viburnum lantana)

Features: Soft fuzzy leaves in a sage green colour emerge in mid-May. White flowers in large clusters appear in early June followed by yellow berries that change to red and then to black. This dense globe shaped shrub is one of the most drought and alkali tolerant cranberries. Fall colour is a rich red.

Light: Sun Zone: 2

Mature height: 6-7 ft Mature spread: 6-7 ft



Midnight Wine Weigela (Weigela florida 'Elvera')

Features: Metallic burgundy foliage is highlighted by profuse reddish-pink flowers in early June. Hummingbirds are very attracted to this shrub. Prune to shape immediately after flowering. This very compact shrub is best planted in full sun to maintain the intense leaf colour. Plant this shrub where it will receive deep snow cover to ensure good winter protection.

Light: Sun Zone: 4

Mature height: 2 ft Mature spread: 2 ft



Minuet Weigela (Weigela florida 'Minuet')

Features: Dark pink, slightly fragrant, trumpet shaped flowers in spring bloom against attractive purple tinted green foliage. This shrub prefers full sun and consistent moisture.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 2 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



My Monet Weigela (Weigela florida 'Verwig')

Features: This dense compact shrub is attractive to hummingbirds. Clusters of rose pink, trumpet-shaped flowers with yellow anthers appear along the branches in late spring. White, pink and green foliage depends on light exposure—whiter in shade, pink in full sun. Fall colour is brick red.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 4

Mature height: 1-2 ft Mature spread: 1-2ft



Red Prince Weigela (Weigela florida 'Red Prince')

Features: This shrub has a loose arching growth habit. Tubular deep red flowers bloom profusely for a long period in spring. Foliage is bright green. This shrub is great for attracting hummingbirds.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 3 ft Mature spread: 3 ft



Wine and Roses Weigela (Weigela florida 'Alexandra')

Features: Bright rosy-pink flowers bloom in late spring against rich dark burgundy foliage. This small shrub prefers consistent moisture. It should be planted where it will receive deep snow cover in winter for protection.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 2-3 ft Mature spread: 2-3 ft



Dwarf Arctic Willow (Salix purpurea 'Nana')

Features: This small upright rounded shrub has purple coloured stems and narrow grey-green foliage which turns yellow in fall. It is attractive in the winter when its stems glow. Nice for a hedge or as a specimen in the border, it can also be mass planted to stabilize moist banks. It prefers moist to wet conditions.

Light: Sun **Zone:** 2

Mature height: 3-4 ft Mature spread: 4-5 ft



Blue Fox Willow (Salix brachycarpa 'Blue Fox')

Features: This small upright globe has attractive fine textured blue-gray foliage. It is great as a specimen in the border or foundation plant. It adapts well to windy sites and can add movement to the garden as it sways in the breeze. Like most willows it prefers moist sites.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 4 ft Mature spread: 5 ft



Coyote Willow (Salix exigua)

Features: This underused shrub is perfect for banks or low lying areas. It grows well in moist sand and gravel. It is thicket forming with pale green silvery leaves and silvery twigs. Catkins appear after the first leaves providing early spring pollen for honeybees. It is very disease and pest resistant.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 12 ft Mature spread: 6-7 ft



Flame Willow (Salix 'Flame')

Features: With a compact oval shape and dense branching habit this willow can also be pruned as a small tree. The bark on the new branches is brilliant orange-red, providing dramatic winter interest. Leaves are a glossy narrow green oval, turning vibrant yellow in the fall. This is fast growing and makes an excellent screen.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 10-12 ft Mature spread: 8-10 ft



Hakura Nishiki Willow (Salix integra 'Hakura Nishiki')

Features: This lovely small shrub has pink stems and buds that open to dappled green, pink and white foliage. The stems are graceful and spreading. We do not consider this variety to be consistently hardy but many are surviving as a smaller piece requiring pruning low to the base in spring and flushing out with bright coloured new growth.

Light: Sun Zone: 3

Mature height: 3-5 ft Mature spread: 3-5 ft

Pussy Willow (Salix discolor)

Features: Our own native pussy willow features soft, fuzzy catkins in very early spring before the leaves emerge. The flowers are excellent for cutting. It has bluish green foliage throughout the season with smooth dark brown bark. Its growth is upright and spreading. It prefers moist conditions.

Light: Sun to part shade **Zone:** 2

Mature height: 12-15 ft Mature spread: 8-12 ft



Rosemary Willow (Salix elaeagnus angustifolia)

Features: Long slender, silver grey leaves, resembling the herb rosemary, emerge in the spring on dark brown stems. Over the summer, the leaf colour matures to a dark bluish green with a white underside. This shrub is fast growing and responds well to pruning. It would make and excellent hedge or formal specimen. It prefers moist conditions.

Light: Sun to part shade

Zone: 3

Mature height: 8-10 ft Mature spread: 7-8 ft
